## **Task Description**

#### **IN-CLASS CHARACTER ESSAY**

QUESTION: How does an author use language to create a character that is effective or memorable?

In your response, select any character from the novel you have studied in class. You may discuss:

- The character's personality, attitudes, actions and relationships with others
- What the character experienced in the novel
- Key issue/s raised by the character
- The language features used to represent this character
- What the dialogue used by the character revealed
- Your personal response to the character

## **Expectations and Task Conditions:**

You will compose your essay during class time over four lessons, beginning Monday 17<sup>th</sup> June to Thursday 20<sup>th</sup> June. (Teacher will collect your writing drafts at the end of each lesson and re-issue to you in the following lesson.)

You are permitted to have a copy of the novel with you, while you write your essay during class time. You are permitted to bring in a prepared 'Cheat Sheet', that contains notes and quotes from your novel, that you plan to use in your in-class essay. 'Cheat Sheet' to be no more than 300 words and not to contain any full sentences.
