Task description

Part A: Writing Task

- 1. What elements of **Ben Quity**'s artwork and art practice demonstrate aspects of the **subjective** frame?
 - a. Use at least TWO of Quilty's works to guide your discussion.
- 2. What elements of **Frida Kahlo's** artwork and art practice demonstrate aspects of the **cultural** frame?
 - a. Use at least TWO of Kahlo's works to guide your discussion.

The writing task must:

- Have a defined introduction, body and conclusion
- Demonstrate knowledge of the Frames
- Write in a detailed manner
- Write at least 500 words

You may choose to comment on their use of scale, paint application, subjects, concepts, and overall feelings produced by the works.

Part B: Artmaking Four 'Frames' Portraits

For this task there are basic requirements, they are as follows:

- 1. You must create four portraits. Each artwork must focus on one of the frames (SUBJECTIVE, CULTURAL, POST-MODERN, STRUCTURAL)
- 2. Each artwork must represent a person
- 3. Each work needs to be evaluated in your diary. (Describe your process, what you like about your work and/or what you would do differently next time).
