Task description

Students are to plan, conduct, analyse and communicate an individual practical investigation. There will be time dedicated in class to teaching the explicit skills required to succeed in the task. The investigation must be quantitative which means that they take measurements not observations.

Each student will be provided with a scaffold that they need to complete. From this completed scaffold, students need to complete a scientific report. The scaffold and the report are required to be submitted at the same time on the due date.

As there is a research element, students will need to include a reference list. These sources of information need to be referenced appropriately. Referencing websites can be used to assist with this.
