**TASK DESCRIPTION:**

You are to complete an in-class hand written test on topics of **The Nature of Business and Business Management**. The test will consist of multiple choice questions, true / false questions and short answer questions. There will be five minutes reading time and 80 minutes working time over a double period, on Friday 21<sup>st</sup> June (Week 8, Term 2). The test will be open book, with students able to utilise their own written notes (no computers or textbooks). If students have typed their notes they are to seek prior permission from their teacher to use these notes in the Topic Test.

**COMPLETION OF STAGE 6 ASSESSMENT TASKS:**

- Tasks submitted on a set date (“hand-in” tasks) must always be submitted before 3:15pm.
- Where at all possible students should discuss concerns about their ability to complete the task with their class teacher prior to the due date. Students are advised to submit an Illness/Misadventure form at the earliest possible indication that there may be an issue completing the task.
- Failure to submit the assessment task at the time and date set for submission will result in an award of **zero** marks to the student for that task.
- An N warning letter will be issued to the student if the student fails to submit the task on time. For multiple N-Warnings the student will have an interview with the Head Teacher and/or the relevant Deputy Principal.
- A task that has been awarded zero marks must still be completed and submitted for marking, in order to satisfy the syllabus outcomes of the course
