## <u> PART 3</u>

Theory/Critical and Historical (10%)- Research Task- Google Slide Presentation

Research and create a Google Slide Presentation on a traditional Asian ceramic technique AND a contemporary artist who uses or is influenced by that technique.

- Students will pick one traditional ceramic technique or style from the table below and create a presentation that includes information on the history and cultural significance of the tradition.
- Include photographs of the technique and analysis and exploration of how one contemporary ceramic artist is using or adapting the tradition today in their own practice. Refer to the questions/scaffold in the Google Slide template on Google Classroom to support your research.

Your presentation should include the following (the slide numbers are just a suggestion, you can add more slides if you wish):

Slides 1 & 2: An introduction/overview of the technique and its history- include text (approx 200 words) and images. Key questions to answer: What country did it originate from? What time period?	Slides 3 & 4: An analysis of the technique's characteristics and significance. Research the history and cultural significance of the tradition. Key questions to answer: What are the characteristics of this technique? What does it look like? What makes it unique or distinctive? What materials are typically used in this technique? What are some common forms or designs? How has the tradition evolved over time? How are these pieces used, for example, in tea ceremonies, everyday use, etc.
Slides 5 & 6: Example of a contemporary ceramic artist using or adapting the traditional technique/style today. Include a brief biography of the artist (100 words) and images. Key questions to answer: How is this artist building on or departing from traditional techniques? What are some of the cultural or artistic influences that are shaping their work? Are they changing tradition to fit modern/contemporary context?	Slide 7: Your own reflections on the technique/style and its relevance to contemporary ceramics. What do you like/don't like about it (give reasons)?
