Outcomes:

<u>Task:</u>

This task consists of 2 parts, a practical component and supporting folio. The requirements are as follows.

Part One: Practical (25 Marks)

You are required to create a patchwork style cushion cover that showcases the elements and principles of design through a range of aesethic techniques that we have covered in the first module. The cushion cover is to follow one of the colour palettes studied in *Module One* of your workbooklet (Achromatic, Monochomatic, Triad, Harmonious, Complementary, Split complementary).

Requirements:

- Cushion cover must follow one of the colour palettes listed
- Consist of a minimum of 9 pannels (only required on the front of the cushion)
- 6 of the 9 shapes must include an aesthetic technique
- Cushion closure must be either a zipper or buttons
- Cushion dimensions are to be 45cm x 45cm

Possible Aesethic Techniques:

- Embroidery
- Frills, Ruffles, Pleats
- Gathers
- Shirring
- Fabric Printed with your own design
- Beading
- Tye Dyeing
- Screen Printing
- Quilting

Part Two: Supporting Document (25 Marks)

The following supporting document needs to be displayed in an A4 Art portfolio or A4 Display folder. It can be created digitally and printed out, or be a mixture of both digital and hand drawn. You are required to document the following:

Design Inspiration:

- 1. **Story Board (1 page):** This needs to be a college using the same colour palette you have shown to use for your cushion. This can be done digitally on Canva or similar program, or can be done by using magazines. Your story board needs to show your inspiration behind your cushion.
- 2. Inspiration (1 page): In one paragraph explain how the inspiration in your mood board has influenced the design of your cushion cover.

Visual Design Development:

- 3. **Sketches (2 pages):** Sketch 2 different designs to show the development to your final design. These sketches should clearly indicate the link between inspiration and design. Make sure you label the different techniques you would use in each design and include a PMI (Positive, Minus, Improvement) for each design.
- 4. Final Design (1 page): Sketch your final design. It needs to include a front and back view and be fully rendered and labelled with any design features and inspiration links.

Investigation, experimentation and evaluation:

 Fabric and Notions (1 page): In a table format list each fabric and notion you have used and evaluate it under the following headings Fabric, Sample, Fabric Properties, Technique Applied. An example has been provided below

Shopping List:

- 1/2 meter of cotton fabric for the back of your cushion
- ¹/₂ meter of cotton fabric for the **front** of your cushion because you have 9 different patches to fill you can choose a range of different fabrics to use, you can purchase different fabrics ¹/₄ meter in size so that you have a variety to create your cushion panels with.
- Closure: Zipper or buttons
