## Task Description

#### **Designing and Making - 20%**

- Design and make at least one body adornment or accessory
- The object must be based on the local climate or environment
- You must include a critical reflection and evidence of your design process in your diary

#### **Critical and Historical Studies - 10%**

Your historical study is a study about one culture or country that uses jewellery to celebrate a significant occasion or adorn themselves.

- Your Study is to be presented as a Visual Verbal in your Process Diary over two pages (minimum).
- Think about the way you present your work; make it reflective of the culture or event you are researching (background textures and colours, pictures, page embellishments, etc)

#### Include the following information in your Visual Verbal

- Name of the topic and brief information on the country and history
- What type of jewellery do the people from this group make? What does it look like? Why is it significant to their culture? What is its significance to a cultural ceremony?
- Materials and techniques used to create the jewellery? Is it a difficult skill to learn? Are the techniques passed down through family members?
- Good quality images should be used to support your investigation. (you can print or draw)
- Use full sentence and paragraph structure (No bullet points or single word answers).
