Task description

<p>Part 1 (10 marks): You will create extended response plans for BOTH of the following questions:</p> <div style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 5px; margin-bottom: 10px;"> <p>Question 1</p> <p>“To what extent was Greek victory due to Athens in the Persian Wars?”</p> </div> <div style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 5px;"> <p>Question 2</p> <p>“Evaluate the changing nature of the Delian League in this period.”</p> </div> <p>The plans MUST NOT be in the form of a pre-written response. You should use your plan to practice writing essays in your own time in preparation for the timed in-class response.</p> <p>Part 2 (20 marks): In class, you will be given the option of ONE of the above questions to answer as an extended response. You will not be told which question you will be required to answer until the day of the task. You will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • be given 45 minutes to write your response • be allowed to use your plan to help you write your response. <p>You must submit BOTH extended response plans on the day the response is completed in class.</p> <p>Both extended response plans and your written response will be marked for this assessment task.</p> <p>You are allowed to submit draft plans only for feedback.</p> <p>See the next page for a detailed marking criteria for both the extended response plans and the written response.</p>
