Task: Contemporary Ceramics and Reflection

Part A- Practical Ceramic Work and Diary (20%):

- Create a body of contemporary ceramic works that reflects approximately 10 weeks of sustained practice.
- Demonstrate experimentation with ceramic techniques, materials, and concepts.
- Your work should show evidence of skill development and creative decision-making.
- Your diary should include: reflections, research, sketches, and development ideas

Part B - Reflection/Proposal (10%): Write approximately 600–800 words discussing:

Reflection: Use the following headings

- **Creative Process** Discuss your creative process over the past 10 weeks, including successes, challenges, and areas of growth.
- Techniques- How your chosen techniques and concepts have evolved.
- **Inspiration-** Include an artist who has inspired your work (technical, conceptual, or thematic influence). Provide a brief analysis of how their practice has informed your own and include images.

Proposal:

- Your plan for your Body of Work moving forward, including your **concept, intended techniques, artistic intentions and plans for installation.**

Assessment Criteria:

- Demonstration of technical skill and creative exploration in ceramic work
- Depth of reflection and analysis, including reference to an inspirational ceramic artist
- Clarity and structure of the proposal for the Body of Work
- Completeness and organisation of the process diary
- Presentation and resolution of practical works.
