Task description

You need to research about an individual or a group who are discriminated against in society. You will present your information in writing (preferably, typed if needed). In a maximum of 500 words:

Select one of the following:

- People with a disability
- Indigenous peoples
- People from another country
- People from non-Christian background
- Elderly people
- LGBTIQ+
- You may select another individual of group in society (you must discuss with your individual teacher)

Your research is expected to include:

- 1. Provide an explanation of what discrimination is. (2 Marks)
- 2. Choose one of the selected groups on the list and answer the following questions
 - a. Provide a brief explanation of the form of discrimination, and why you have chosen it. **(2 Marks)**
 - b. How common is this discrimination? (2 Marks)
 - c. Why is discrimination against this group against the law? (3 Marks)
 - d. From the research you have completed, analyse the reasons for this discrimination. **(4 Marks)**
 - e. What can this group or individual do if they are discriminated against? (2 Marks)
 - f. Who can this group contact to get help if needed? (support groups, government bodies) (2 Marks)

Assessment Criteria

Students will be assessed on their ability to:

- Clearly explain Discrimination
- Analyses the effects of discrimination against a particular people
- Understands and assists the development of resolution mechanisms.
