Year 7 School vaccinations

According to the latest research, Australia is on track to become one of the first countries in the world to completely eliminate cervical cancer. Infection rates of the Human Papillomavirus have declined dramatically in Australia since the introduction of the National Schools Vaccination program in 2007. Australian scientists developed the HPV vaccine and Australian schools have been the first in the world to introduce the free vaccinations program.

According to the Australian Institute for Health and Welfare, the national average rate of vaccinations in 2016–2017 was 94%. The Northern Rivers has an average rate of 77%. Richmond River High students took part in the program last week, with 71% of Year 7 students receiving vaccinations.

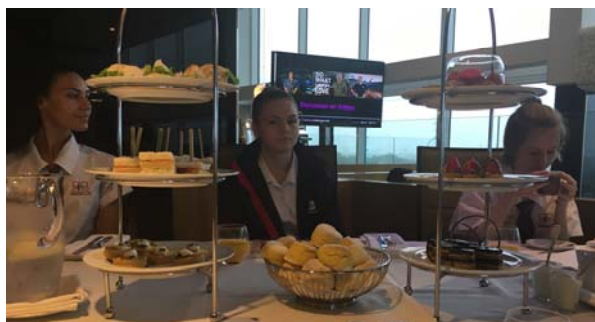


Women's Leadership Development High Tea
