## VICTORY FOR THE RICHMOND RIVER MOCK TRIAL TEAM

Richmond River High's Year 11 Mock Trial Team has been victorious in their first Mock Trial case against Trinity Catholic College. They won their court case, successfully proving that their client Jake Reed (Garth Gulliver) was not guilty of a charge of assault occasioning actual bodily harm. In addition, the Richmond River High team won the case on points 245-238.

Outstanding performances in this case by the Richmond River team were given by all the members of the team. Seth Taylor-Smith gave a highly adept performance as First Barrister; displaying a real flair for cross examination, presenting legal arguments in his opening statement and contributing his legal knowledge to our case. Luca Jones was a confident Second Barrister, delivering a very strong closing statement and performing well in examining the witnesses.

Garth Gulliver, the accused and our first witness, was cool under pressure under cross examination and confidently rebutted any suggestions that his bag scratched his neighbour, Scott Smith, as they boarded a train at Hurstville Station. Zachary Perkins, our second witness, the platform conductor, was also clearly able to reject any suggestions that he didn't carry out his duties appropriately in this case.

Finally Scarlett Singer was highly organised and a great team player as our Solicitor; preparing clear pre-trial and trial notes and assisting our legal team, while Lily Hart was highly efficient in running the court room as the case's Court Officer.

Congratulations to the Richmond River High Mock Trial Team on an outstanding performance in their first Mock Trial. I look forward to seeing them develop as lawyers in the coming cases, as they definitely have the attributes to be wonderful legal practitioners.

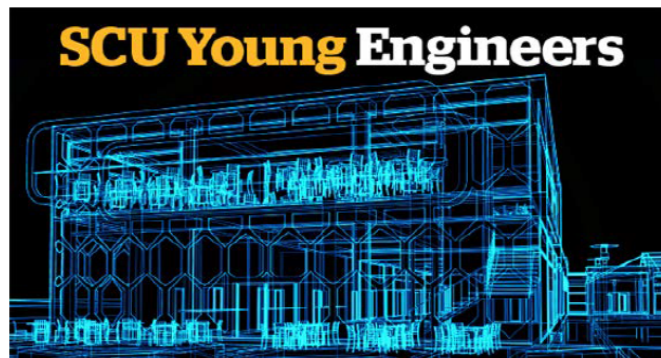
