On Tuesday 3 April, the Year 11 Biology students travelled to beautiful Brunswick Heads to undertake some sampling activities in a variety of coastal habitats. The purpose of the excursion was to practice specific skills and techniques that Scientists use regularly to determine abundance and distribution of organisms in ecosystems.

A very good turn-out from the excellently behaved and engaged RRHC students along with perfectly timed sunny weather and knowledgeable experts, Cindy Picton, Tamlin Mackenzie from Dorrroughby Environmental Education Centre, and John Larrison from Ozfish, meant that the excursion was a total success. The data collected by the students on this excursion will be entered into a local database that monitors populations of native, introduced and endangered species in the area. This data will also allow comparisons in the future to determine the ecological health of the area.
