It is Week 3 and NAPLAN testing is over for another year. As you may be aware there has been a great deal in the media recently about the possible refreshing/remodelling/removing of the NAPLAN testing regime and in my mind this will be a good thing. NAPLAN is an incredibly useful tool for gaining an extremely generalised snap shot of how a particular cohort of students performs against the broader cohort of the whole country, and the cohorts who preceded them. Unfortunately it can also be used to compare schools to other schools, as well as states to other states, again as a very generalised view this can be handy but in my experience the information is open to misuse. There has to be a better way.

I hope you are all enjoying the Autumn weather, it might be wise to remind your young person to pack a jumper (black, grey or red – no motifs) into their bag, there were several requests last week for office staff to contact parents to bring in a jumper to a slightly blue-ish tinged child! And of course the usual varieties of colds and coughs are doing the rounds so a reminder around personal hygiene may be useful as well.

Next term will see the performance of 'River Rock', a play written, scored and performed by members of The Rivers Secondary College. **School Attendance**

Regular school attendance is important for so many reasons.

In your child's high school career eight days per term lost means they have lost a full year of schooling. That is enough to make a serious difference to anyone's learning.

It affects other things as well as learning. It affects relationships with teachers, friendships with other students. It also fails to build good habits required for work attendance later on.

Arriving late causes disruption to the learning of the student and it also disrupts the learning of the whole class.

After a day's absence it takes time to catch up on lost learning. Sometimes this time is never made up and holes exist in your child's learning.

In our efforts to raise strong adults of the future, regular school attendance is vital.

As the experts say "You can't learn if you don't attend."

85% attendance is required by the Department of Education and then they can pursue the matter with ever increasing penalties.

So keep your kids coming to school as it is to everyone's advantage, particularly your child's.


## Museum of Human Disease – a professor streams into RRHC

#### Are your children attending different schools?
