Mock Trial wins third case in a row, but goes down in narrow points decision

RRHC Mock Trial Team put up a strong fight in their third court room, battle, again facing Trinity Catholic College who they narrowly defeated in their first round case.

In their third round case, RRHC Mock Trial team successfully defended their client Holly Ridge (Nakeeta McDonald); resulting in her being found Not Guilty of the offence of possession of stolen or unlawfully obtained goods in custody. Unfortunately the points decision resulted in a narrow points loss for the team 234-224, in what was a very hard fought courtroom battle.

All of the members of the team again acquitted themselves with distinction in this case. Seth Taylor-Smith as first barrister delivered a strong opening statement and examination-in-chief, while Luca Jones also performed well in his cross-examination and closing address.

Both of the RRHC witnesses, Nakeeta McDonald and Hunter Mircev-Cox, who kindly stepped into the team at the last minute, were successful in their story that Holly Ridge (Nakeeta) had not stolen the Wally Lewis Australian jersey and other items from their neighbour's clothes line. Instead the magistrate accepted their account that Holly's young children had taken these clothes and also two large bags of clothes and strewn them across the backyard, before a kindly neighbour Fay Moyle (Hunter) scooped all the items up together and washed them.

Once again, we should be extremely proud of the RRHC Mock Trial team. They are exemplary ambassadors of our school and the skills they have developed as legal practitioners are outstanding. Congratulations!

What a Wonderful Night

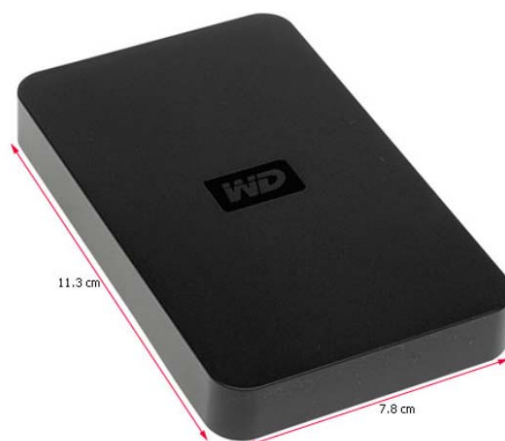

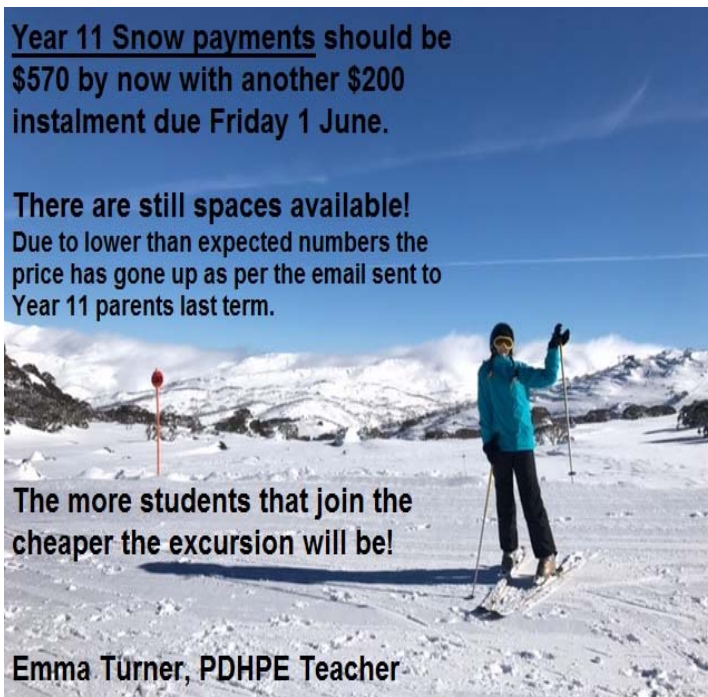

Are your children attending different schools?

Don't worry, School Stream caters for multiple schools from within the app itself. Jump between your children's schools by touching the school logo/name, or switch schools from the slide-in menu.

Choose which notifications you receive:

1. Open the School Stream app on your mobile device
2. From the slide-in menu, go to **Settings**
3. Under **Edit/Alerts** select **My Schools** and select your School to open the **Notifications** page
4. Toggle notifications on or off individually (e.g. Alerts, Events, Newsletters, etc.)
5. When you have finished, use the **Back** button to return to the **Settings** page, then select **Done** to return to your School
6. Return at any time to change the notifications you receive.
