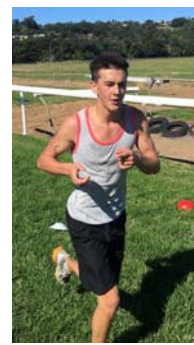
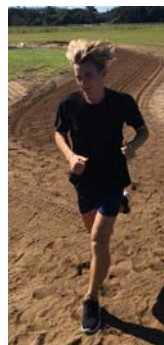
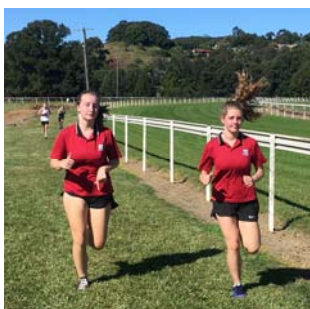
## Zone Cross Country

## Casino Beef Week – Hoof and Hook results

RRHC were overall winners of the schools section of the Hoof and Hook Competition at Casino Beef Week. This is an outstanding effort by our Agriculture students. In Hoof section one steer finished 4th in the Schools Competition and top ten in the Class 2 section. This steer made 650c/kg. Our Class 1 steer made 520c/kg both steers were bought by Holiday Coast Meat & Smallgoods, Grafton, who are good judges of steers as they were placed 1st and 6th in the Hook competition. Results in the Hook competition – First place in School Competition, First place in Class 1 and 6th place in Class 2.

The students had a great day starting at 4.30am at RRHC. Steers were loaded at 5.30am and were weighed in at 6am in Casino. The School Competition started at 8am with twenty eight steers being exhibited from schools across the region.

## From the Community Liaison Officer (CLO)

Last week my granddaughter came to visit me. She is 22 months old and has not been to visit for more than three months. I was amazed and delighted to see her go around the house and the yard and repeat many things that she had done last time she was with me. To me that said that children are listening and learning even when we do not notice. As our kids get older they are also filtering what they have learned to accept or reject. We have no control over that. It is for them to work out as they go while we have our fingers crossed that it will all work out. We continue to model those things that are important to us like respect, tolerance, a good sense of humour, and application to the job in hand. We can remember that kids are watching and learning from our actions.

My granddaughter also reminded me that we are always playing 'catch up' with our kids. As soon as we think we know them and understand them, they have grown a new maturity and we are trying to get a handle on the new element of their growing up. Certainly it takes time and patience to stick to the job of parenting and the results are not there for us to see until many years later.

School is here as a support for that process and by working with school staff your chances of a good outcome improve.

I am happy to meet with parents and carers anytime on a Wednesday.

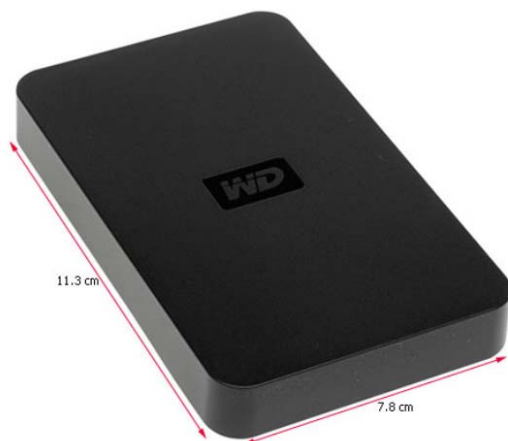
