Mock Trial Success

RRHC Mock Trial Team maintains perfect record in winning cases but defeated narrowly on points

After another monumental courtroom battle with Trinity Catholic College on Thursday, our RRHC Mock Trial team were again successful in proving their case - winning all four of the cases they presented in court this year. The fact that the RRHC Mock Trial team was able to successfully present all of their cases is an outstanding achievement and is a testament to the hours of preparation that have gone into every Mock Trial.

The trial was extremely hard fought and all of the RRHC Mock Trial members in this case represented RRHC commendably. The team in this case comprised Seth Taylor-Smith (First Barrister), Nelene Hunold (Second Barrister), Luca Jones (solicitor), Scarlett Singer (1st witness), Nakeeta McDonald (2nd witness) and Garth Gulliver (Magistrate's Clerk) all performed extremely well.

Seth has thoroughly enjoyed honing his cross-examination skills this year and he shows strong potential to be a formidable Barrister of the future. Nelene performed well in her first appearance as a barrister in her examination-in-chief and closing statements. Luca has enjoyed the courtroom battle this year and has been a sharp competitor. Scarlett was outstanding on the witness stand receiving one perfect '10' score. Lastly, but certainly not least, Nakeeta and Garth performed very competently in their first appearances as a witness and a magistrate's clerk respectively. The final scoreline of 245-232 indicates that all of the members of our team performed well and utilised all of the legal skills they have developed this year.

The case our team successfully proved, in representing the Plaintiff in this civil case, is that a father was negligent in making it possible for his daughter to take his gun and accidentally shoot our client; even though he had not given his permission for his daughter to take the gun.

Stem Club - 4 Wheel Balloon Car Challenge

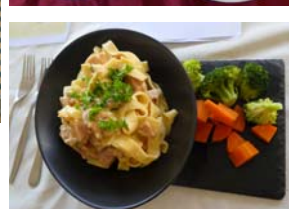

Time Management Tips to Support Your Child

As a parent or carer I guess we have all had that experience of our child doing the last minute panic when an assignment is due tomorrow. We can help to develop important time management skills for life.

In the Classroom:

Record all homework tasks on the day they were given

Record longer term tasks and the day they are due

Record all targets set and when they are completed

Use study time effectively

Managing time out of school:

Arrange time in order of priority

Check off assignments as they are completed

Organise time in half hour blocks

Take time to review work returned by teachers

Commit time to revision schedule and stick to it

Managing time to complete tasks:

Prepare schedule which includes leisure time

Take a short break to reward the completion of a task

Divide long tasks into short time units

Wait one day before editing work

Reflect regularly on use of time and set priorities

Where possible include the following:

A quiet place to work

Equipment on hand: pen, pencil etc.

Healthy food

Fresh air and exercise

Knowledge that they are supported by you in their efforts

Relaxation time

Monitoring of part time work commitments

Are your children attending different schools?

Don't worry, School Stream caters for multiple schools from within the app itself. Jump between your children's schools by touching the school logo/name, or switch schools from the slide-in menu.

Choose which notifications you receive:

1. Open the School Stream app on your mobile device
2. From the slide-in menu, go to **Settings**
3. Under **Edit/Alerts** select **My Schools** and select your School to open the **Notifications** page
4. Toggle notifications on or off individually (e.g. Alerts, Events, Newsletters, etc.)
5. When you have finished, use the **Back** button to return to the **Settings** page, then select **Done** to return to your School
6. Return at any time to change the notifications you receive.
