
Dolphin Dreaming

Carr Scholarship

The Carr Scholarship is a legacy from Peter and Margaret Carr where each year five RRHC Year 12 students can be awarded \$10,000 scholarships to help with their tertiary education costs. The award is given for the purpose of supporting the student's progression to university through the payment of course fees, accommodation costs and the purchase of related texts and equipment. Funds are released to the recipient when the student has enrolled and commenced at university.

Carr Scholarship will be awarded on the basis of the following criteria:

- 1. Highest ATAR scores. Proof of ATAR Score from Universities Admission Centre must be attached to application.
- 2. Positive citizenship based on nil student suspensions during Years 11 and 12. Applications to be emailed to eden.weir@det.nsw.edu.au by 3.30pm Wednesday 18 December.

WorldSkills Competition - Primary Industries

RRHC held one of the three regional school finals for the WorldSkills Competition in Primary Industries. WorldSkills is a National Championship that operates on a two-yearly cycle. This is Australia's biggest vocational education and excellence competition. Over three days the successful students selected from the regional competitions are flown to showcase and benchmark their skills on the national stage competing against their industry peers. The 2020 Australian Championships are being held in Perth. Students had to demonstrate skills to a national standard in a range of activities including fencing, cattle handling, tractor work, chemical application, communication, and teamwork. Three Independent examiners assessed the skills of students at all three regional competitions to ensure consistency while completing the designated activities. Congratulations to Jack Conroy who placed second in our competition and Lauren Whitney who placed fourth. Congratulations to everyone who participated and supported this event.
