
Year 7 Day Out



Safe parking in School zones Take the time to ensure your child's safety

No stopping



Fine exceeds \$325 and attracts a penalty of two demerit points.

What does it mean? You cannot stop in this area for any reason.

Why? To keep sight lines clear for drivers and children so both have more time to avoid accidents.

Stopping on a continuous

YELLOW LINE will also attract a \$253 fine.

A driver must not stop at the side of a road marked with a continuous yellow edge line. It means the same as the No Stopping sign.

Picking up your

children after school

No apologies, no excuses

Have a plan

Plan with your child how you will collect them.

- When and where will you be after school?
- Where should your child wait?

Make sure they know not to try and get into your vehicle while it is still in traffic. Even if you are stopped, they should wait until you have parked. Your school may have some arrangements in place to help you collect your children.



When it comes to child safety, Lismore City Council makes no apologies for issuing infringement notices to drivers who break the law in and around school zones.

Illegal parking in school zones puts children at risk and endangers lives. Parking offences in school zones carry heavy fines and loss of demerit points.
