

Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) to School

Bring your own device (BYOD) is where students use their own devices for the purposes of learning at school. The recommended devices for school are **Windows Laptops**, **Windows Tablet**, **Apple MacBook or iPads**.

Device Requirements:

All devices must have:

- 1. Wireless Compatibility: Device must have 5GHz 802.11n support to gain access to the Internet at school. This may be advertised as:
 - Wi-Fi 6
- Dual Band Wireless
- 802.11ac 802.11abgn
- 802.11agn Gigabit Wireless.
- 2. Battery Life: Advertised battery life of at least six hours.

Note:

- 1. A physical keyboard attachment with separate keys is recommended for Tablets.
- 2. Recommended screen size between 11" 14" (screen size larger than 14" is too heavy and large to be safely carried around)
- 3. It is important that sudents keep their passwords up-to-date and current to be able to access their BYOD devices and their DoE school portal, email, GSuite and MSOffice365.

The department and the school do not endorse any particular brands or devices and parents are advised to carefully consider all their options for purchase and lease/rent-to-buy. Smaller tablet devices may be half the price of a larger sized laptop. Purchase of a brand new device is not essential as students may already have a device or may be able to acquire a second-hand device that is suitable. In fact, many students are already bringing their own devices and connecting to the school network.

BYOD is a personal education tool and as such the department/school cannot supply support for faulty devices (software or hardware). The department advises that accidental loss and damage insurance should be considered.

The school has purchased software Texthelp Read&Write Gold to assist students to read, write, organise, study, research and be numerate. It can be used across the curriculum. It also helps achieve greater independence and move towards becoming lifelong learners. Students will be able to install this software on their BYOD devices through the school.
